

2023 Hawai'i History Day District Hybrid Entry Guidelines

ALL ENTRIES

- All Entries must be submitted electronically and uploaded into the registration system by 11:59 PM, February 10, 2023 **except the actual performances, for those who are entering into the performance category.**
- Students should refer to the category checklist in the NHD Rulebook to make sure they have completed everything required for their entry.

- Hawai'i History Day, unlike National History Day, does not separate individuals and group entries for Exhibits, Documentaries, Performances, or Websites. Advancement to the State fair is not guaranteed, even if there is only one entry that is either an individual or group.
- Divisions
 - Youth division includes grades 4-5.
 - Junior division includes grades 6-8.
 - Senior division includes grades 9-12.

*Note: Youth Division Projects are not eligible for the Washington DC National History Day Contest

PERFORMANCE ENTRIES

- A Performance entry may be submitted by either an individual or group of up to three students.
- Performances may not exceed 10 minutes in length.
- The Process Paper and Annotated bibliography need to be uploaded into the entry registration.

EXHIBIT ENTRIES

- An Exhibit entry may be submitted by either an individual or a group of up to three students.
- For 2023, at the District level, students can either submit images of their physical exhibit board (they create a board, take pictures, and put the pictures into a slide presentation) or upload a virtual exhibit board (eg: Google Draw). Since judging will be done online, there has to be either a virtual formatted board or images of the board uploaded into the system, in accordance with the NHD Exhibit Guidelines, in order for the board to be judged.
 - Note: If the Exhibit board advances to State or National levels, the board will need to be a physical Exhibit Board.
- Submit the Process Paper first, the Annotated Bibliography second, and the Exhibit (Using the NHD virtual template as one PDF into the registration system.

PAPER ENTRIES

- Historical papers are limited to individual entries. Groups cannot submit essays.
- Students must submit their essay, process paper, and annotated bibliography as one PDF into the registration system.
- Papers must contain between 1,500 and 2,500 words

DOCUMENTARY ENTRIES

- A Documentary entry may be submitted by either an individual or group of up to three students.
- Documentaries may not exceed 10 minutes in length, including credits.
- A weblink to the documentary MP4 and a PDF of the Process Paper and Annotated bibliography need to be uploaded into the entry registration.

WEBSITE ENTRIES

- A Website entry may be submitted by either an individual or group of up to three students.
- All Website entries must use the NHD Web Central website platform.
- The 8-digit, NHD Web Central entry code is required to register the website.

‘ŌLELO HAWAI‘I ENTRIES

- Students can submit their entry in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, following the same project guidelines for each category.
- These entries will be judged in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, and student interviews will be done in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

*Note: Currently, 'Ōlelo Hawai'i projects are not eligible for the Washington DC National History Day Contest. We do however, hold national project showcases for top 'Ōlelo Hawai'i projects.
